Ingredients

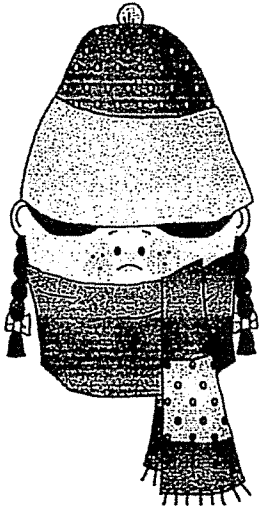
- 8 cups snow, or shaved ice

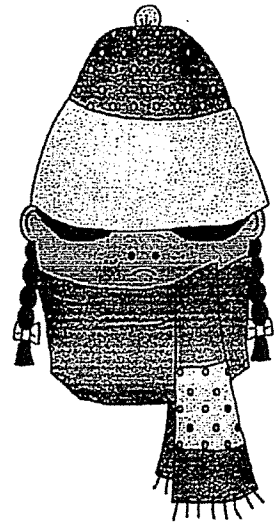

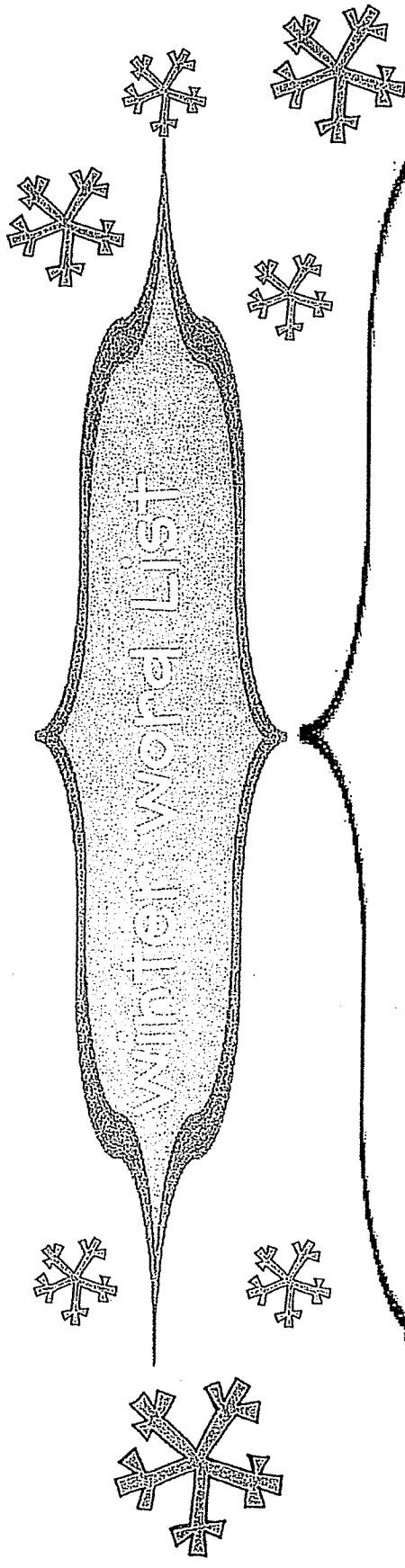

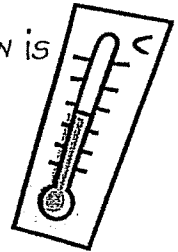

What is Snow?

Snow is frozen water that falls from the sky. All snowflakes have six sides, but no two snowflakes are the same.

Snow is precipitation in the form of small white ice crystals. Snow is formed from the water vapor in the air at a temperature of less than 32 degrees Fahrenheit.



What state of matter is snow?

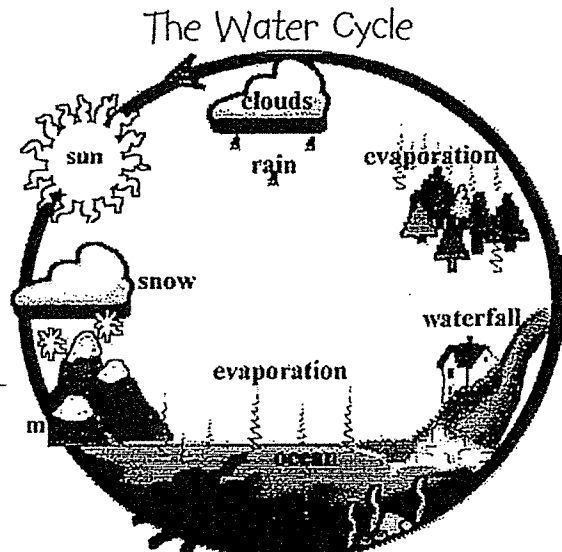
Snow is a type of solid precipitation that forms in clouds when the air temperature is below freezing.

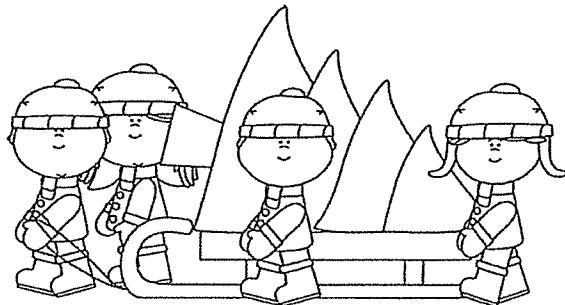

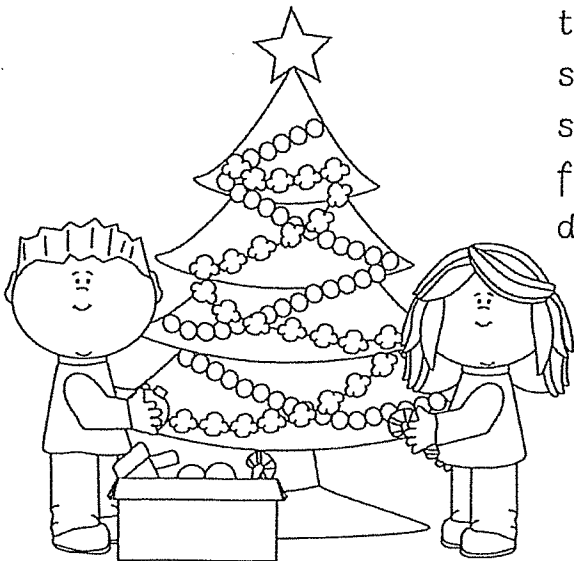

The third graders used their money to buy a Christmas tree for the senior citizen's center. They had \$3.15 left over. How much did the tree cost?

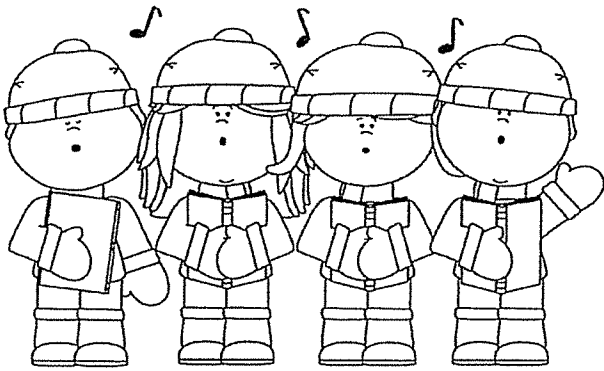

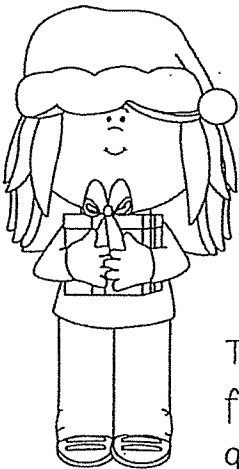

Thirty-two second graders from Happy Hills went to Children's Hospital to share Christmas carols. The students were divided into groups of 4 to visit different sections of the hospital. How many groups of singers were there?

Each group of second-graders sang six songs. How many songs did they sing in all?

Fifth grade students from Happy Hills Elementary earned money by doing gift wrapping at the mall. They wrapped a large gift for \$4.00, a medium gift for \$3.00, and a small gift for \$2.00. On Saturday morning, they wrapped four large gifts, seven medium gifts, and three small gifts. How much money did they earn on Saturday morning?



They earned \$14 more on Saturday afternoon than they earned on Saturday morning. What was the total amount they earned on Saturday?

The fifth graders used their money to buy fabric to make quilts for the homeless shelter. Large quilts cost \$34 each, and small quilts cost \$15 each. If they made two large quilts, would they have enough money left to make any small quilts? If so, how many? Would they have any money left over?
